

OUR YEAR IN REVIEW

Thanks to the dedication of our supporters, board members, volunteers and staff, the Center experienced another year of success in achieving our mission to help others. In 2014 we:

- Dispensed a total of 552 financially-assisted hearing aids, exceeding our 2014 goal by 22 devices. Much of this is due to a strengthened relationship with Missouri Vocational Rehabilitation offices;
- Served a total of 14,156 area children by providing a simple hearing and vision screening, the most ever in the School Screening Program's 45-year history;
- Expanded our Speech-Language Program satellite locations to 12, adding much needed therapy services at Most Holy Trinity Catholic School in north St. Louis City;
- Realized new dynamic leadership with our Young Friends group, which also adopted formal bylaws and initiated a social calendar resulting in membership growth to develop and nurture the next generation of Center supporters; and
- Received a Better Business Bureau Torch Award, presented to only two local charities a year, crediting the Center as "demonstrating a commitment to customer service through exceptional standards for ethical business practices."

We're proud of these accomplishments and it is our hope that you are, too. Without your support, we couldn't have realized these achievements, as well as our ability to help others everyday with their communication disorders.

Center Programs: Helping Others

Individuals of all ages, from infants to centenarians, benefit by receiving full assessments of their hearing ability, hearing aids, hearing aid repairs and ongoing consultations with the Center's experienced doctors of **Audiology**. Addressing hearing loss through amplification improves life quality, propels children to greater academic success, reduces anxiety and depression and contributes to overall better health.

Children with speech/language disorders or delays can struggle significantly in their learning environments. The Center's **Speech-Language** pathologists work with children so they achieve clear, articulated fluent speech and have mastery of all basic language concepts; the foundation for successful education. Adults also benefit from therapy programs to combat stuttering or vocal abuse or to regain the ability to speak and process language following a traumatic brain injury. Speech and language disorders commonly accompany other conditions, such as autism and Downs Syndrome.

There is high incidence of hearing and vision problems in young children that often go unrecognized. The Center's **School Screening** technicians provide hearing and vision screenings and tests of middle ear function for children at area schools and childcare centers. School nurses and families of children who did not pass a screening receive recommendations for medical follow-up.

Noise exposure in the workplace can lead to permanent hearing loss if preventative measures are not in place. The Center's **Industrial Hearing Conservation** certified technicians perform annual hearing tests for employees who work in noisy environments. Our industrial audiologist consults with employers on how best to preserve their employee's hearing ability. This is the Center's only profit-producing program, with generated revenue supporting Audiology, Speech-Language and School Screening programs.

"Alexander was born with a hole in his heart and started struggling with asthma, then it lead to seizures in his sleep," his mother shares with tears in her eyes. "The seizures caused him to slur his speech." Alexander has been in speech therapy for about a year and now has excellent word comprehension but struggles frequently to come up with the correct word. He works to strengthen how he describes what he wants to say.

School was not always a positive experience for five-year-old Kevin. He would come home upset and frustrated that his teachers and classmates couldn't understand him. His Center therapist, Kimberly, says Kevin has come a long way since his first day of therapy. "Kevin's motor skills are improving and I can see a huge increase in his confidence because of his successes so far," she says.

Kevin's dad agrees and is appreciative of the assistance his son has received. "As a family, we are very grateful for this opportunity and to be awarded financial assistance. If it was completely private pay, we wouldn't be able to have weekly therapy appointments for Kevin."

"Oh, my life has changed a lot since coming to the Center,"
Patricia says. "There are lots of things I wasn't hearing that I
am actually now able to hear. It's like being reborn!"

"I don't need to ask my grandkids to repeat things, write it down or spell it out. Now, I hear every word that they are saying to me. My first reaction to getting my hearing aid was just to let tears run down my face. "The only thing I could say was, 'I CAN HEAR!"

After falling and suffering a head injury that affected Barbara's hearing, both listening to the television and having conversations with the staff at her rehabilitation center were a struggle. It was hard for her to converse with anyone. "I'm so thrilled I could cry! This is the place to be; the compassion and knowledge of the staff are amazing." Barbara has been coming to the Center for more than a year for audiology services and received hearing aids for both ears.
